Ms Knight Writes

Dear AWPS families,

Welcome back! I hope you have all had a lovely break. Some parents and carers embrace the holidays and love not having the school routine dominating the week. Others are counting the days until school is back! Either way, I hope the holidays went smoothly for everyone and that 2025 has started well. The fires over the holidays were a huge stress for many families, and it feels like the Grampians is really under siege at the moment. We are thinking of everyone who has been or is still being impacted by the fires. I have been to Willaura and the Blaze Aid camp at the Recreation Reserve is huge. This is an amazing charity that sets up in disaster areas, and volunteers help remove and replace burnt fencing. Our JSC will be up and running soon and I will suggest to them that a casual clothes day for Blaze Aid would be a great Term 1 fundraiser.

Start of the Year: Well done to all our families for booking in for testing days, and for starting the year on such a positive note. The students looked amazing coming back to school. There were lots of fresh new uniforms, new shoes, and smart haircuts. One of our goals as teachers for 2025 was to get started with learning straight away. Today is day four at school, and we are back into the swing of things already. Having consistent staff really helps – it has been a seamless start to the year!

New and Returning Staff: We welcome Miss Kim Crabtree back two days a week. Kim will be in Mrs Fithall's class on Wednesdays and Ms Hann's class on a Friday. We also welcome back Mrs Hope on Tuesdays this term, taking Foundation Auslan and Year 3/4 science. We also have lots of new Education Support staff. The Education Department in Victoria has a new funding model, and this has helped most schools secure some extra funding for students needing additional support. We also have slightly bigger classes than previous years in F/1/2 and having ES in those rooms is incredibly helpful. Welcome to Bec, Deb, Georgia, Leah (just here for two weeks before uni starts), Holly and Mia. Holly and Mia are training to be teachers and will also be doing their teaching rounds this year, along with their ES work. We had Jackie, Alvina, Kate, and Dani with us last year and they are back this year. And Tracie, Megan, Fiona and Kim you all know - they have been at West for a while! Lots of our ES support individual children, take small groups, support in the yard at recess and lunch, run Spelling Mastery groups, and hear children read. On the first day of the year all our ES completed a speech program, learning how to support children who aren't quite articulating sounds properly. That will be another way we will be using this expertise this year.

Communication: If there is anything you are unsure of, please just ask your child's classroom teacher for anything to do with teaching and learning or the classroom/camps/excursions. Anything to do with school charges, first aid, admin – all the general things, Tianee at the office is your best contact point. Being on XUNO is really important. We will increasingly use XUNO to communicate with our families, and our plan is to transition to being almost paperless and things like permission for camps and excursions can all be done via XUNO.

Swimming: Information will come home for Year 3 – 6 students about our swimming sports trials, and the actual swimming sports carnival. This is another new thing for me too. I haven't been at AWPS at the start of the year, so there are lots of things happening that I am learning about. Please read that information carefully and again, check in with your child's teacher if you have any questions. The permission application has now been uploaded to XUNO, so please log-in and approve the Swimming Sports Carnival.

Hot Days: The first two days this week were shockingly hot. We try to let students outside at recess each day, then keep them inside at lunchtime on hot days. If you are worried about your child on hot days (some children do feel the heat more than others) please just let your child's teacher know.

Reports and Parent/Carer-Teacher Interviews: A survey will come home about the ways we communicate with our school families regarding student learning. We know that many of our families want more information about their child's learning but getting this right for all families is tricky. Writing reports takes time and we are considering the best way to communicate with families. We are required to provide written end of semester reports twice a year and this will not change. Interim reports, parent/carerteacher interviews, and other forms of information (e.g. term overviews, curriculum documents) are all up for consideration. Further information to come, but when the survey comes out, we are very keen to hear from as many families as possible so that we get this right for you!

Kindness: We are having a focus at school on how we speak to and look after each other. We do want our children to be able to stand up for themselves, but at times children (and adults!) can react quickly to things and bite back, or not always speak to others in a way that is kind and respectful. The image included in the newsletter about kindness is important. It could be a good one to print and pop on the fridge at home.






The school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school or search for the school by name.

If you're within 10 kms of the school, you can select our school from 'Nearby Locations'



ATTENDANCE

Children should not arrive at school prior to <u>8.40am</u> as there is no supervision prior to this time. Please ensure your child arrives at school before <u>8.50am</u> so they are ready to start class on time. An <u>absence note</u> is required

each time your child is away, these are recorded and filed. Please ensure you include the date of, and reason for each absence in the note as this is a Department requirement. If your child is late to school, they need to go via the office for a pink slip before going to their classroom. As it is extremely important that we know the whereabouts of all students, especially during an emergency, please fill in the Sign In/Sign Out iPad at the front office if you need to collect your child during school hours.

These changes are vital to keep your child/ren's details up-to-date in case of an emergency.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 5352 1909 or email ararat.west.ps@education.vic.gov.au and ask for an application form.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office <u>as soon as</u> possible.


AMBULANCE TRANSPORT




This applies to all schools in rural Victoria, therefore all students need to be covered by Ambulance Subscription or one of the above cards.

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones are important modern day communication tools, essential in providing a safe and effective school environment. However, they can easily be improperly used, lost or damaged and must therefore be effectively managed. Many of our students now have their own mobile phones. We actively encourage parents to be aware of the content that is being sent and received by their child as well as ensuring that the phone is not being used for bullying or harassment of others.



In circumstances where it is necessary for students to bring their phone to school, students are to adhere to the mobile phone policy we have in place and bring to the Front Office first thing in the morning and collect at the end of the day. Contact with your child can be made through the office, or if necessary we will contact you if your child is ill. Please feel free to discuss any issues you may have with Ms Knight.

ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATION INFORMATION

<u>Notify the school of your child's absence</u> - Protecting the safety and well-being of children through the reporting and monitoring of absenteeism is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools.



Please remember to call the school on 5352 1909 or email at ararat.west.ps@education.vic.gov.au early in the morning if your child is going to be away or late for school so your child's absence can be recorded correctly. If your child is late for school they must come via the Front Office for a Pink Slip to ensure their attendance is recorded.

<u>Same-day notification of unexplained student absences</u> - Our school will text/call you as soon as practicable on the day if a student is not at school and you haven't notified the school as to why. If you are notified by the school that your child is away without a reason, please contact us as soon as possible by to let us know where your child is. If we cannot reach you because we don't have your correct contact details, then we will make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school, where possible, on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Please remember it is your responsibility to contact us to provide an explanation for your child's absence from school, and where possible, please inform us in advance of upcoming absences.

Save this number! Our school uses SMS/text to contact parents/carers as soon as practical on the day on an unexplained student absence. Save this number 5352 1909 into your phone so you know it is the school contacting you if you receive a text.

<u>Attendance Requirements</u> - If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify the school as soon as possible on the day of absence, by the above methods.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

PRIVACY COLLECTION STATEMENT - Primary Schools

Information for parents and carers

During the ordinary course of your child's attendance at our school, school staff will collect your child's personal and health information when necessary to educate your child, or to support your child's social and emotional wellbeing or health in the school context. Such information will also be collected when required to fulfil a legal obligation, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law. If that information is not collected, the school may be unable to provide optimal education or support to your child, or fulfil those legal obligations.

For example, health information may be collected through the school nurse, primary welfare officer or wellbeing staff member. If your child is referred to a specific health service at school, such as a Student Support Services officer, the required consent will be obtained. Our school also collects information provided by parents and carers through the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

Our school may use online tools, such as apps and other software, to effectively collect and manage information about your child for teaching and learning purposes, parent communication and engagement; student administration; and school management purposes. When our school uses these online tools, we take steps to ensure that your child's information is secure. If you have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact us.

School staff will only share your child's personal or health information with other staff who need to know to enable the school to educate or support your child, or fulfil a legal obligation.

When our students transfer to another Victorian government school, personal and health information about that student will be transferred to that next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of our students and assists that next school to provide optimal education and support to students.

In some limited circumstances, information may be disclosed outside of the school (and outside of the Department of Education.) The school will seek your consent for such disclosures unless the disclosure is allowed or mandated by law.

Our school values the privacy of every person. When collecting and managing personal and health information, all school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law. Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, Student Support Service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners and all other staff at our school. This includes employees, agents and service providers (contractors) of the Department, whether paid or unpaid.














